

DRINKING WATER WARNING
Alburgh Village Water Department WSID 5136
BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING
Friday April 26, 2024

Due to the need for system maintenance/repair including but not limited to leak repair there is a strong possibility that your drinking water supply may become contaminated on the way to the tap. This situation presents a significant health risk to users of the Alburgh Village water system. Alburgh Village is issuing a Boil Water Notice for all of South Main Street, Route 2 South, West Shore Road, Lake Street, McCoy Woods, Deso Drive, Deso Drive Ext., Deso Drive Circle, Baker Street, Cleland North, Cleland South, Vantine Ave. Peterson Place, Winters Lane, Winters Lane Ext., Ethan Lane, Jarvis Lane, Wood Lane, Buck Lane, Kirk and Fitts, Kirk and Fitts North, Firehouse Road, Mott Street, Mott Street North, Mott Street South, and Mott Farm Road including South Alburgh Fire District **effective Friday April 26, 2024 thru Tuesday April 30, 2024**

What should I do? DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes, and food preparation **until further notice**. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water. Coliforms are bacteria which are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially-harmful bacteria may be present. When a water system is experiencing fluctuations in water pressure the possibility exists for bacteria and other harmful organisms to enter the water distribution system and contaminate your drinking water supply. People with severely compromised immune systems, infants, and some elderly may be at increased risk. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. What happened? What is being done?

The water main had to be shut down to perform a leak repair. This Boil Water Notice will remain in effect until the water system maintenance/repair is complete and the system is able to demonstrate that the quality and quantity of the drinking water meets State and Federal drinking water standards. We will inform you when the necessary system maintenance/repair has been completed and tests show no bacteria present in the drinking water supply. We anticipate resolving the problem within 3-4 days.
